Summer School dates: August 8-11, 2023

Venue: Loyola University Chicago (Water Tower Campus)

We are soliciting proposals for workshops in English and/or French for the Partnership on University Plagiarism Prevention (PUPP) 2023 Summer School. The Summer School will take place on 8-11 August at *Loyola University Chicago* (USA).

The purpose of the Summer School is to provide a chance for interested participants to discuss and learn about “*Teaching and Learning with Integrity*”. The Summer School will gather Ph.D. students, faculty, administrators, librarians, academic staff, among others.

We invite proposals from interested parties to deliver 75- or 150-minute workshops related to the Summer School theme *Teaching and Learning with Integrity*. Specific topics include but are not limited to:

- Academic integrity
- Research integrity
- Writing with integrity
- Ethical use of sources
- Equality, diversity and cultural sensitivity
- Plagiarism prevention
- Integrity education
- Plagiarism detection
- Plagiarism in scholarly writing
- Responses to integrity violations
- Copyright and fair use
- Roles and responsibilities
- Libraries and integrity
- Academic integrity policies
- Scholarly publishing

We particularly encourage proposals for highly interactive and collaborative workshops. Workshops that are of special interest to Ph.D. students are also encouraged.

PRE-WORKSHOP EVALUATION CRITERIA:

Workshop proposals will be peer-evaluated based on the following criteria. Their order below does not reflect their importance.

Targeted Audience	The community's interest in the topic (Ph.D. students, faculty, administrators, librarians, academic staff, among others).
Impact Statement	How the workshop will generate new discussion or momentum on the topic.
Workshop leaders' expertise and experience	Please make sur that workshop leaders are listed as authors of the workshop proposal submission. Include brief presenter(s) biographies to demonstrate ability to run a workshop, and appropriateness to the workshop on this topic.
Contribution	Creating and improving community of practice around academic and research integrity.
Collaboration	We encourage interdisciplinary workshops.
Pedagogical Approach	Participants' engagement and interactions: active and effective strategies to stimulate participation throughout the workshop.
