## Speaking Test Rubric:

The Speaking Test will be assessed based on the following criteria, each of which carries a maximum of 20 points:

1. Accuracy (20/100 points):

- Demonstrates precise and appropriate use of grammar, vocabulary, and sentence structure.
- Minimizes errors in grammar, verb tense, and word choice.
- Effectively communicates ideas without causing confusion or misunderstanding.

2. Fluency ( $\mathbf{2 0} / \mathbf{1 0 0}$ points):

- Speaks naturally and confidently, without excessive pauses or hesitations.
- Maintains a consistent and appropriate pace of speech.
- Links ideas together coherently and smoothly.

3. Pronunciation ( $\mathbf{2 0} / \mathbf{1 0 0}$ points):

- Clearly articulates words and phrases.
- Uses correct intonation, stress, and rhythm.
- Pronounces difficult sounds accurately or demonstrates an effort to improve pronunciation.

4. Content (20/100 points):

- Provides detailed, relevant, and informative responses to the questions.
- Supports answers with examples, personal experiences, and relevant information.
- Stays on topic and avoids unnecessary repetition.

5. Comprehension ( $\mathbf{2 0 / 1 0 0}$ points):

- Demonstrates a solid understanding of the questions asked by the examiner.
- Responds directly to the questions, addressing all aspects of each question.
- Reacts appropriately to follow-up questions from the examiner, showing comprehension.


## Scoring:

- The total points for each criterion will be summed up to calculate the overall score for the Speaking Test. The maximum total score is 100 points.
- Feedback will be provided based on the specific areas where improvement is needed.
- An exemplary performance would score close to or at 100 points, indicating a high level of language proficiency, clarity, and engagement.
